

Introduction: Proposal to Develop an Optional Skills Rating Systems for use by SCA Pickleball Club Members

As the number of SCA residents playing pickleball has increased significantly from an initial club size of 86 members in 2010 to over 510 members in 2023, it has become important to make sure the needs of all of our club members are met in a variety of different ways. Over the last decade, some of our club members expressed the desire to be competitive and wanted us to organize tournaments, classes, and weekly meet up events. We did this. Now we face a different type of desire/need from many of our members; their desire to play against players with similar skills levels in games and in tournaments. Many different pickleball clubs have responded to this growing demand to categorize or group players into skill levels over the last six years and in fact, over 20 HOA pickleball clubs have adopted a skills rating system in the Southwest alone.

As many other clubs throughout the country have found out, developing a skills rating system can be a productive way to meet the needs of most, if not all, of their playing members who want to play against players of similar ability levels. Starting in March of this year, two SCA board members and some of your pickleball veterans decided to form a subcommittee (***) to explore and ultimately propose a new skills rating system. To ensure members actually wanted to use a new pickleball skills system, the skills subcommittee**, developed a short survey in April of 2023 to gauge potential member support for the development of an optional rating system and asked members for their input. The results showed 67% of the members supported the development of a ratings system (74 out of 111) This was very encouraging to the Board and we decided to develop a description of how the system could be developed at SCA and how it would work. However, some of the club's members gave us feedback that they had not been given enough information on how the skills rating system would work and how it would affect their opportunities to play if they opted out of the skills rating system. These members asked us for another opportunity to vote on the skills rating system after they had seen more information on how the system would work. We have developed two documents to meet this request for more information:

The voting system on the website will be open from Monday July 31st to Thursday August 31st. You will not be able to cast a vote before or after this time period.
